

MBA Education's Certified Mortgage Banker (CMB®) Designation Program

The CMB® designation signifies to the real estate finance community an individual's superior knowledge, understanding, and competency in residential and/or commercial real estate finance and distinguishes professionals for their steadfast commitment to excellence and high ethical standards. Candidates may choose to enroll into the Residential or Master CMB* program.

NOTE: The Master CMB program is currently unavailable for enrollment for new candidates. We anticipate availability will be open in late 2019.

At the time of application it is recommended that you have at least five (5) years' professional industry experience.

<u>Once you have submitted the enrollment fee (\$350 – Members / \$1,050 – Non-Members)</u>, please submit a CMB Candidate package containing the following information:

- Current Résumé and/or MBA Education Transcript Update Form
- Name of CMB Sponsor (If you do not have one, we can assist you with locating one)
- Letter of recommendation from senior level employee (VP or SVP or company equivalent) on company letterhead
- Contact information from two (2) professional business references
- Signed agreement to abide by MBA's Canon of Ethics and Standards

Each candidate must earn at least 150 CMB points to advance to the written and oral examination testing phase.

These points are earned in three categories:

Professional Experience (Minimum 25 points - Maximum 75 points)

- Employment with a MBA member firm (5 points per year)
- Employment with a non-member firm (3 points per year)

Education (Minimum 35 points - Maximum 75 points)

- Undergraduate Degree (15 points)
- Advanced Degrees (i.e. Masters, MBA, JD) (10 points)
- MBA Education's School of Mortgage Banking Course I and II (15 points each)
- MBA Education's School of Mortgage Banking Course III (30 points)
- MBA Education Distance Learning (self-study & instructor guided) Courses − 1 − 5 points*

Effective 3/7/16, all MBA Education Self-Study Web Based courses have been reduced to 1 point per course

- MBA Education Classroom-Based Programs Two (2) points per every 8-hour day
- MBA Education Webinars ½ point
- MBA's Future Leaders Program (15 points)
- CMB Prep Course (5 points)
- Non-MBA Educational Programs
 - Webinars: ½ point
 - Self-paced or Instructor Guided Distance Learning Courses: 5 points per every 15 hours of training
 - Classroom-based: Two (2) points per every 8-hour day

Industry Participation (Minimum 25 points - Maximum 75 points)

- MBA Committee Member Five (5) points per year
- MBA Convention or Conference 1 point per meeting day
- State or Local Convention or Conference 1 point per day
- State or Local committee participation 5 points per year
- Non-MBA Convention or Conference (must be industry related and non-social in nature) 1 point per day
- Speaker at MBA or MBA Education event 1 point per session, up to 10 points per event
- Subject Matter Expert (SME) for MBA Education* (review & edit courses, publications or classroom programs in development) 2 10 points per project
- Habitat for Humanity 1 point per day (maximum of 10 points total)

<u>Please note that you are not required to accumulate the 150 points prior to enrollment as you will have three</u> (3) years from the date of enrollment to complete all requirements and obtain your CMB Designation.

Matriculation and Completion of the CMB Designation

Once a candidate has accumulated 145 points and met these minimum point requirements, he or she is eligible to take the comprehensive written examination. You can prepare for the exam by registering for a Residential CMB prep course - a course designed to help you familiarize yourself with the topics covered on the written exam. The Prep Course registration fee is \$350 (members) or \$1,050 (non-members). Remember, the exams are based upon the knowledge you have gained throughout your entire career. Your professional experience and interaction with other professionals in the industry is the best preparation for taking these exams.

After successful completion of the written exam and have met the required 150 CMB points, the candidate can advance to the oral interview. The candidate's CMB sponsor must give approval for the candidate to take the written examination and to appear before the CMB Orals Panel. The exam fee is \$350 (members) or \$1,050 (non-members), which covers both the written and oral exams.
